The project taken on by the Eastport VFC entailed purchasing a surplus medic unit from a nearby county. After the purchase was made, and body damage and corrosion was repaired, the unit was repainted and

lettered with the traditional red and white. Thanks to Annapolis City Fire Chief David Stokes, Eastport VFC was able to obtain the assistance of the City fire department's repair shop to install the emergency lighting.

Medic Unit 362 may run in conjunction with the city owned PM36 which is located at the Eastport station. If PM36 is in use, firefighters can utilize Medic Unit 362 to respond, saving time and freeing up neighboring resources. This new requisi-

tion ultimately improved emergency medical services

in Eastport, the City of Annapolis, and other areas of Anne Arundel County.

In a citation received from County Executive, Laura Neuman, it states "*The citizens of Anne Arundel County have benefitted from your vision, leadership, and commitment to make our community a better place to live and work.*"

This training program was developed in partnership between MSFA and MFRI to help administrative members manage the business of running a volunteer fire or EMS organization. The class is broken into four modules:






## **Fire Officer II Class Scheduled**





Name of product recall: Candle Ring - Pine Berry by Yankee Candle Company— Hazard: The candle rings synthetic foliage and berries are flammable.



Name of product recall: Kenmore oscillating fan heaters SOLD BY Sears and KMART— Hazard: Broken motor mounts can cause the units to overheat, catch fire, and ignite nearby items.

Carbon monoxide, also known as CO, is called the "Invisible Killer" because it's a colorless, odorless, poisonous gas. More than 150 people in the United States die every year from accidental non-fire related CO poisoning associated with consumer products, including generators. Other products

include faulty, improperly-used or incorrectly-vented fuel-burning appliances such as furnaces, stoves, water heaters and fireplaces.

Have your home heating systems; furnace, chimneys and vents inspected and serviced annually by a trained service technician.
Never use portable generators inside homes or garages, even if doors and windows are open. Use generators outside only, far away from the home.

- Never bring a charcoal grill into the house for heating or cooking. Do not barbeque in the garage.

- Never use a gas range or oven for heating.

- Open the fireplace damper before lighting a fire and keep it open until the ashes are cool. An open damper may help prevent build-up of poisonous gases inside the home.

- Install battery-operated CO alarms or CO alarms with battery backup in your home outside separate sleeping areas.

- Know the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning: headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, sleepiness, and confusion. If you suspect CO poisoning, get outside to fresh air immediately, and then call 911.
